

Domestic abuse is defined as any incident, or patterns of incidents, of coercive, controlling or threatening behaviour, violence or abuse between those aged 16 or over who are, or who have been, intimate partners or family members regardless of gender or sexuality.

This includes psychological, physical, emotional, sexual and financial abuse.

The Dash Charity are the commissioned providers of domestic abuse support for the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead. We support women, men and children who have experienced domestic abuse in all forms,. We have a refuge for women and children who are fleeing from abuse, and support women and men at home to manage their safety in our Advocacy and Outreach team. We were one of the first organisations to have a dedicated Children's Services Team, which provides awareness workshops and one-to-one therapeutic work for children who have witnessed domestic abuse.

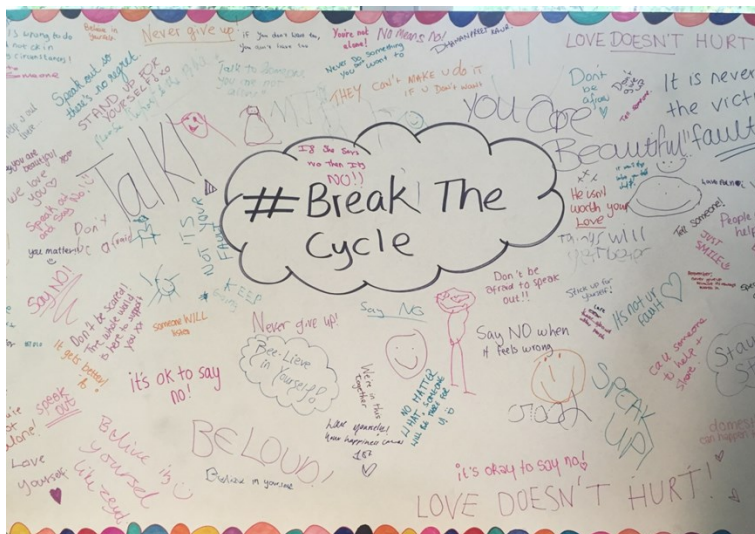
